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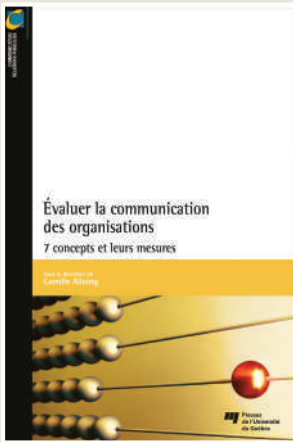

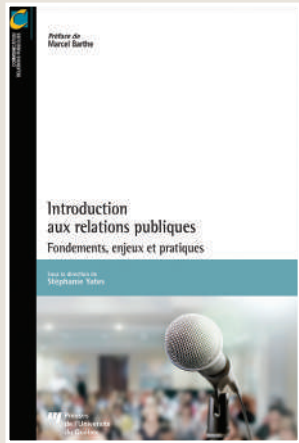

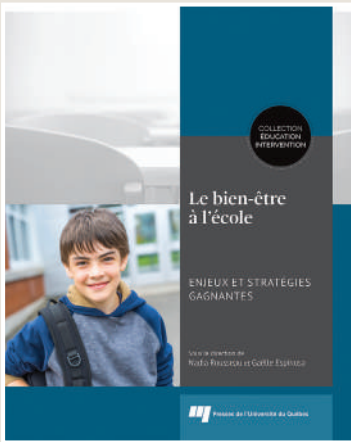

Moving beyond the standard, subspecialized and compartmentalized approaches, Nancy Fraser provides an opportunity to take a deep dive into the current multidimensional crisis (social, economic, political, ecological, and health) and possible solutions, while remaining focused on the critical theory, which seeks to identify forms of domination and strive for emancipation. Members of CRISES (Centre for Research on Social Innovations), the authors evoke Nancy Fraser's theory of social justice to better understand the case studies presented in this book. Cases involve living conditions of single-parent immigrant women, and people who are marginalized and homeless, as well as working conditions of university research professionals, and of temporary foreign workers in the poultry industry. They also involve specific collective organizations, such as habitat-santé le Mimosa du Quartier, les Maisons familiales rurales in France, or work cooperatives for taxis in Europe and in waste collection in Brazil.

The work of Michel Foucault is in a class of its own since it covers a wide range of topics (philosophy, sociology, history, anthropology, criminology, medicine, psychology, linguistics, law, etc.). Foucault is not a sociologist in the classic sense, but his social theory is powerful and innovative. Which one? How can we use this today? How is it relevant for theorizing on social issues? What are the associated benefits, limitations, disadvantages? What is the style of “social reasoning” taken from his vast and complex work? These are the questions that guide an analysis of Foucault’s overall work in this book. Following the historic chronology of his research as well as the innovative directions of his thinking, this book is mainly intended for a university readership, and it demonstrates the rich theoretical and methodological evolution in Foucault’s theories.
